REPORT OF THE ECA INDUSTRIAL CO-ORDINATION MISSION TO EAST AND CENTRAL AFRICA

Corrigendum

As noted in the report of the East and Central African industrial co-ordination mission, it proved impossible for one reason or another for the mission to visit Basutoland, Bechuanaland, Congo (Leopoldville), Madagascar, Swaziland and Zanzibar. Following requests made at the Sixth Session of the Economic Commission for Africa it is hoped that these countries will be visited in the near future. Meanwhile, it should be pointed out that the proposals made in the report of the ECA mission to East and Central Africa should be regarded as provisional in a dual sense. First, more detailed enquiries remain to be carried out. Secondly, suggestions for co-ordination in some industrial sectors are likely to require modification when fuller information on the countries which have not so far been visited is available.

Figure 1 illustrates the experimental design for two groups: Control and Training. In the Control group, a subject (S) interacts with a computer (C) which is connected to a video screen (V). The Training group setup is similar but includes an additional 'Training' box connected to the computer (C). Both setups also include a 'Task' box connected to the computer (C).
