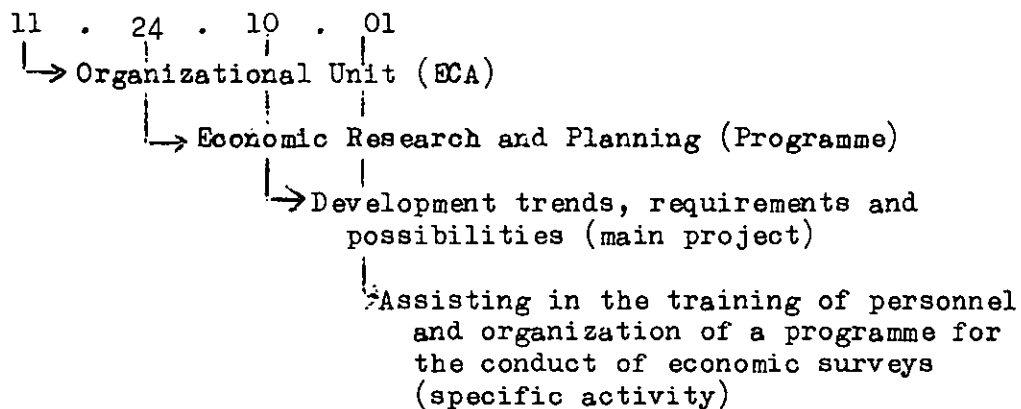
PROGRAMME OF WORK AND PRIORITIES, 1974 AND 1975

Introduction

The following programme of work and priorities for 1974 and 1975 has been extracted from the ECA Annual Report, pages 114 to 201, E/CN.14/591. It forms part of the programme of work and priorities for 1974-1976, with projections to 1979 which was originally prepared in consultation with the Executive Committee and the Technical Committee of Experts of the Economic Commission for Africa in the light of the recommendations of United Nations Economic and Social Affairs Department and other relevant bodies of the United Nations prior to its subsequent endorsement by the Conference of Ministers at its second meeting held at Accra from 19 to 23 February 1973. This two-year programme is in line with Commission resolution 212(IX) requesting the Executive Secretary to present precise work plans for successive periods of two years based on the progress of work in the preceeding biennium and takes into account projects which could not be executed during 1973 as well as recommendations of the Technical Committee of Experts at its fourth meeting held at Addis Ababa from 27 to 31 August 1973.

As will be noticed, the secretariat has introduced as from 1 January 1974 the universal United Nations project coding system in which the Organizational Unit (ECA) is represented by 11, followed by programme in question, main project and finally by the specific activity:

For example:



As usual, in addition to resources obtained from the regular budget, the programme of work and priorities for 1974 and 1975 makes allowance for project implementation with resources from bilateral and other extra-budgetary sources. Furthermore, inasmuch as there will probably be changes in the implementation of the work programme and priorities due to unforeseen circumstances, the Conference of Ministers at Accra reaffirmed its policy of entrusting the Executive Secretary with the establishment of a different order of priorities within the framework of an integrated system of long-term planning, budgeting and programming.

AGRICULTURE
