AFRICAN DIRECTORY OF DEMOGRAPHERS

INTRODUCTION

1. The present Directory is the first attempt to list in one place information on the Demographers from the African countries, as well as on Demographers from other countries who have specialised in demographic studies relating to the region. The demographic specializations of the persons included cover a wide spectrum, sociological, statistical, geographical, medical, etc.

2. Background. At the informal meeting on African Demography, which the Secretariat of the Economic Commission for Africa assisted in organising in Belgrade on 7 September 1965 during the United Nations World Population Conference, it was felt that there was a great and urgent need for closer contact among demographers working on African demography. One way of ensuring this was to issue periodically a Directory of such Demographers; and the secretariat of ECA was requested to undertake this work. The view of the informal meeting was placed before the Fourth Conference of African Statisticians, held in Addis Ababa in November 1965, which recommended that a Directory of Demographers specialising in African studies be prepared by the secretariat. The First African Population Conference, sponsored by the University of Ibadan and the Population Council, and held at Ibadan in January 1966, also noted with satisfaction this recommendation (reported in the Statistical Newsletter, No. 20, March 1966).

3. Collection of data. Directory Data Forms were prepared and issued in May 1966 to all the national statistical offices in Africa, and other interested agencies, universities, institutions and individuals in and outside the region. The medium of the Statistical Newsletter, issued by the secretariat periodically, was used for information and reminders.

The Data Forms were sent to all member States of the Economic Commission for Africa, excluding the Republic of South Africa. All African members of the International Union for the Scientific Study of Population (a non-

governmental organization in consultative status with the United Nations), the Fellows at the United Nations Regional Centre for Demographic Training and Research in Cairo, and the Demographic Fellows of the Population Council were included, even if completed Data Forms were not received in respect of some of them. The Directory, Social Scientists Specializing in African Studies, prepared by the Secretariat of the UNESCO, was found helpful in compiling the present Directory.

4. Presentation of data. Information relating to 204 persons is presented. The classification is by present residence, the African countries being listed alphabetically^{1/}, and within each country the listing of persons is alphabetical. Information relating to persons from other world regions is arranged similarly.

The following summary data were culled from the available information, and are presented in the Directory. For simplicity, the item headings have not been repeated in the body of the Directory, but only the item numbers in brackets. The question of using symbols in place of the item numbers will be examined if the Directory is printed.

- (1) Name: Family name (in capitals), first and other names.
- (2) Nationality.
- (3) Date of birth.
- (4) Present position.
- (5) Other positions currently held, especially demographic.
- (6) Previous position(s).
- (7) Degrees and Certificates at institutions of higher learning.
- (8) Membership of learned societies, especially demographic.
- (9) Fields of specialization and interest.
- (10) Important publications.
- (11) Mailing address.

^{1/} The names of the countries have been arranged alphabetically in English; the order would be somewhat different in French. For one person, whose present address was unknown, the country of nationality was taken as the country of residence.

Information has been presented in the language (English or French) in which it was available.

An index has also been provided at the end, arranged alphabetically according to family names of the persons listed and giving the page number where the names occur.

5. Classification. The distributions of persons listed according to (a) country of residence, and (b) nationality has been presented in Table 1. Further classification of the information by academic and professional qualifications, and fields of specialization and interest may be made when more complete data become available.

6. Reference to proposed African Association for Statistics. The Directory Data Form included a question on whether the person had filled in a form for membership of the proposed African Association for Statistics. This generated a considerable interest, and a large number of persons who had received the forms indicated their interest in joining this Association.

7. Concluding remarks. It is hoped that, in spite of its lacunae, this Directory will be useful to Demographers specializing in African studies, as also to Governments, agencies, and institutions. The Directory will be updated periodically, with more complete information and detailed analysis.

REPERTOIRE DES DEMOGRAPHES AFRICANISTES

INTRODUCTION

1. Le présent répertoire résulte de la première tentative faite en vue de réunir en seul document les renseignements concernant les démographes africanistes d'origine africaine aussi bien que non-africaine. Les spécialisations de ces démographes portent sur une large gamme de disciplines : sociologie, statistique, géographie, médecine, etc..
2. Historique : A la réunion démographique africaine de caractère officieux, à l'organisation de laquelle le secrétariat de la Commission économique pour l'Afrique a participé et qui s'est tenue à Belgrade le 7 septembre 1965, au cours du Congrès mondial de la population convoqué par les Nations Unies, on a estimé qu'il fallait resserrer d'urgence les relations entre démographes africanistes. L'un des moyens d'assurer cette liaison consistait à publier périodiquement un répertoire de ces démographes, tâche dont le secrétariat de la CEA était invité à se charger. Cette proposition a été présentée à la quatrième Conférence des statisticiens africains, réuni à Addis-Abéba en novembre 1965, qui a recommandé que le Secrétariat entreprenne d'établir ledit répertoire. La première Conférence démographique africaine, qui a eu lieu à Ibadan en janvier 1966, sous les auspices de l'Université d'Ibadan et du "Population Council", a pris note avec satisfaction de cette recommandation (voir Informations statistiques, No. 20, mars 1966).
3. Rassemblement des renseignements : En vue de recueillir les renseignements nécessaires à l'établissement du répertoire, on a établi un questionnaire qui a été communiqué en mars 1966 à tous les bureaux statistiques nationaux des pays africains, ainsi qu'aux organismes, universités, institutions et particuliers intéressés, tant à l'intérieur qu'à l'extérieur de la région. A ce propos, le bulletin périodique, Informations statistiques, publié par le Secrétariat a été utilisé aux fins d'information et de rappel.

Ce questionnaire a été envoyé à tous les Etats membres de la Commission économique pour l'Afrique, à l'exception de la République sud-africaine. Il a été également distribué à tous les pays membres africains de l'Union

internationale pour l'étude scientifique de la population (organisation non gouvernementale dotée du statut consultatif auprès des Nations Unies), ainsi qu'aux stagiaires du Centre démographique des Nations Unies au Caire et à ceux du "Population Council"; mais certains de ces destinataires n'ont pas répondu à la demande de renseignements. Le répertoire, Africanistes, spécialistes de sciences sociales, établi par le Secrétariat de l'UNESCO s'est révélé utile pour l'élaboration du répertoire des démographes africanistes.

4. Présentation du répertoire. Le répertoire fournit des renseignements sur 280 personnes classées d'après leur lieu actuel de résidence. Les pays africains sont énumérés par ordre alphabétique^{1/}, de même que les démographes africains indiqués pour chaque pays. Les renseignements relatifs aux démographes originaires d'autres parties du monde font l'objet d'une présentation identique.

Les renseignements récapitulatifs figurant au répertoire ont été extraites des informations disponibles. Pour simplifier la présentation des renseignements, les rubriques se rapportant à ceux-ci ne sont pas répétées dans le corps du répertoire, où seuls figurent entre parenthèses les numéros correspondants. Le point de savoir s'il y aurait lieu d'utiliser des symboles à la place de ces numéros sera examiné si l'on décide de faire imprimer le répertoire. Les données sommaires fournies par ce document sont les suivantes :

- 1) Nom de famille (en capitales), prénom et autres noms utilisés;
- 2) Nationalité;
- 3) Date de naissance;
- 4) Profession actuellement exercée;
- 5) Autres activités actuellement exercées; particulièrement dans le domaine démographique
- 6) Activités antérieures;
- 7) Titres universitaires;

^{1/} Les noms de pays figurent dans l'ordre alphabétique anglais, qui diffère quelque peu de l'ordre alphabétique français. Pour une personne dont on ignore l'adresse actuelle, le pays de nationalité est indiqué comme pays de résidence.

- 8) Appartenance à des sociétés savantes et plus particulièrement à des sociétés démographiques;
- 9) Domaines de spécialisation et d'intérêt;
- 10) Publications importantes;
- 11) Adresse postale.

Il y a lieu de préciser que les informations sont présentées au répertoire dans la langue (anglais ou français) dans laquelle elles ont été communiquées. A la fin de l'ouvrage se trouve un index alphabétique des noms de famille des personnes considérées, indiquant les numéros des pages où figurent ces noms.

5. Classification : Le répertoire comprend également un tableau répartissant les démographes a) par pays de résidence et b) par nationalité. Une classification supplémentaire par titres universitaires et par qualifications professionnelles, ainsi que par domaines de spécialisation et d'intérêt, sera établi lorsqu'on disposera de renseignements complets.

6. Projet d'association des statisticiens africains : Le questionnaire précité, comprenait une question sur le point de savoir si l'intéressé avait rempli un formulaire d'adhésion à l'association des statisticiens africains, dont on envisage la création. Cette question a suscité beaucoup d'intérêt et un grand nombre des personnes interrogées ont répondu qu'elles souhaitent appartenir à une telle association.

7. Conclusions : On espère que ce répertoire, en dépit de ces lacunes, se révélera utile aux démographes africanistes, ainsi qu'aux gouvernements, organismes et institutions intéressés. Cet ouvrage pourra être mis à jour périodiquement, à l'aide de renseignements complémentaires et d'analyses détaillées.

A cet effet, le Secrétariat serait heureux de recevoir des renseignements et suggestions supplémentaires. Les communications à ce sujet doivent être adressées au Directeur de la Division de la Statistique et de la Démographie, Commission économique pour l'Afrique, boîte postale 3001, Addis-Abéba, Ethiopie.

Enfin, le secrétariat de la Commission économique pour l'Afrique tient à remercier tous les démographes qui ont rempli le questionnaire ainsi que les organismes et institutions qui lui ont apporté une aide précieuse pour l'élaboration du répertoire.
