PRE-FINAL YEAR AFRICAN UNIVERSITY STUDENTS ON

"Elements of a Strategy for African Economic Development"  
August 3 - 28, 1964

The joint ECA-USAID Summer School for pre-final year African university students held in Addis Ababa, Ethiopia, in 1961 and 1962 has been transferred to IDEP as a part of its regular activity and will be held in the summer of 1964 in Dakar, Republic of Senegal. About 100 students selected from various universities and university colleges in Africa are expected to attend.

The programme will be run jointly by four eminent guest lecturers and IDEP staff and is expected to last four weeks. The main topic around which the school is being organized is "Elements of a Strategy for African Economic Development" which will be treated in subsidiary subjects, or groups of subjects, relating to its principal aspects.

Emphasis will be concentrated mainly on the strategy, rather than the tactics, of African economic development, and on the methodology for dealing with specific development problems commonly encountered. The lectures will show how the various elements which should be included in the strategy may be selected. While some theoretical background in economics will be assumed and some will also be given, the instruction will centre as much as possible on relevant African case studies, for which material will be assembled by the lecturers, and formal lectures prepared which will eventually be translated and mimeographed and distributed to the students in their respective working language (English or French). A short reading list will be prepared by each lecturer which, it is hoped, will be made available to selected participants for prior reference before their arrival in Dakar to start the course.

Instruction will take the form of lecture-discussions and seminars, each lasting one "working hour" of 75 minutes and will be given in either of the two working languages. Simultaneous interpretation facilities will be available.

Students are advised to bring with them prepared data on the matters to be discussed, such data relating to African countries, conditions and problems. An Outline of the Summer School Syllabus, the allocation of lecturers to topics, as well as a Time Table and a list of lectures constitute a part of this document.

OUTLINE OF SUMMER SCHOOL SYLLABUS AND ALLOCATION  
OF LECTURERS TO TOPICS

Elements of a Strategy for African Economic Development

1. Fundamental Aims of African Development : General aims accepted by African Governments, e.g. independence, cultural advance, self-sustaining increase in income, increasing employment, increasing equality of income distribution.
2. The Structural Basis of Development in Africa : Existing economic and social structures; trends of change in their pattern; structural conditions tending to produce stagnation; conditions favorable to the initiation of accelerated development; human and physical basis of development.
3. Resources for African Economic Development :
  - (a) Domestic resources - human, material and financial
  - (b) Resources from outside - foreign investment, bilateral and multilateral aid and technical assistance, facilities for intra-African and foreign trade.
4. Instruments for African Economic Development and the Role of Government :

National economic planning : project studies continuous adaptation of strategy; the avoidance of disturbances (e.g. inflation, imbalance on foreign account, unemployment, increasing inequality of income distribution); financial and fiscal controls, trade controls, trade liberalization, financial, investment and development agencies and consortiums, nationalization of foreign enterprises, central, regional, local community, industry, sectoral agencies.
5. Programming Techniques in Relation to the Choice of Strategy :

National accounts and Financial Flows, Projections, Input-Output Analysis, Linear Programming, Regional Economic Planning, Comprehensive Regional Development (l'aménagement du territoire).

6. African Economic Integration, Concepts and Problems : Free trade area, customs union, common market, economic union, complete economic integration; conflicts and problems; harmonization of development plans and industrial programmes, transportation and communications systems, monetary systems; African Development Bank.
