KEY HIGHLIGHTS

ETHIOPIA

- Ethiopia reported **112 new** confirmed COVID-19 cases in the last 24 hours giving a total **275,881** confirmed cases as of **26 June 2021**. A total of **4,309** deaths have been reported since the beginning of the outbreak with a Case Fatality Rate is **1.56%**
- 258,491 (93.7%)** cases have recovered, however **252** confirmed cases are undergoing treatment in the treatment centers of which **164** are in severe condition
- In the **last 24 hours**, **5,307 RT-PCR tests** were conducted giving a **cumulative 2,850,570 RT-PCR tests** conducted
- 13,079 total** active cases and **288** recovered and discharged on the same day
- A total **1,988,902** population have been vaccinated that comprise of health workers (**20%**), population between 30-54 years (**03%**), population between 55-64 years (**37%**) and persons 65 years and above (**40%**)

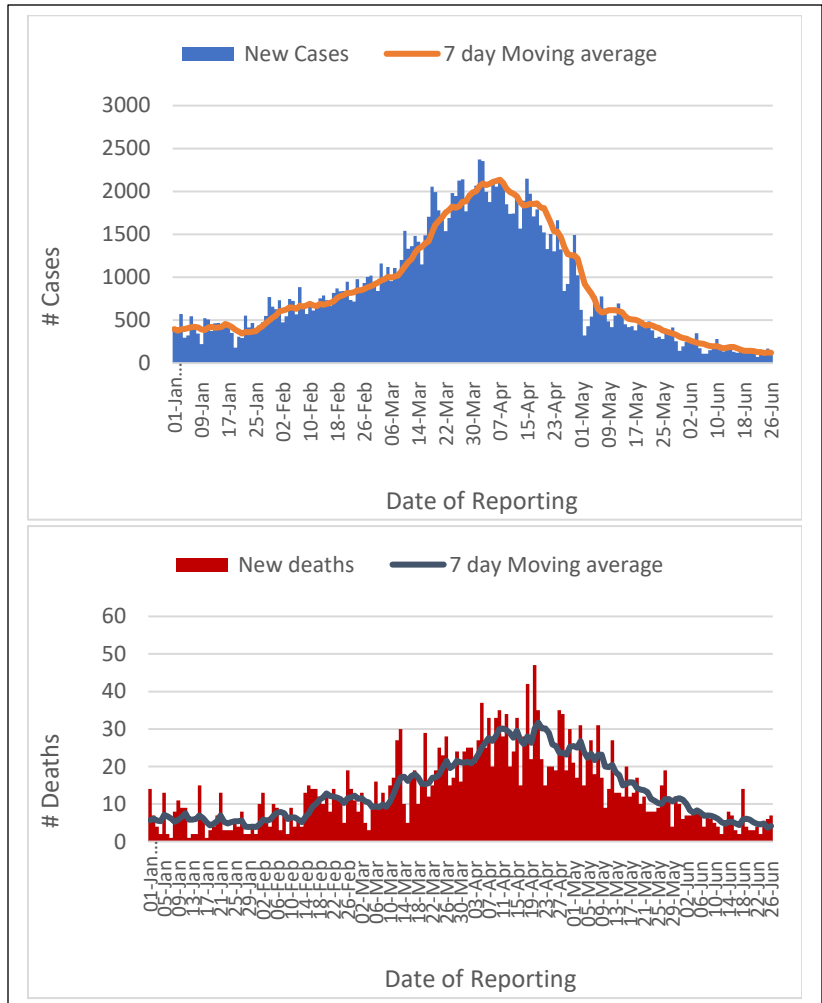
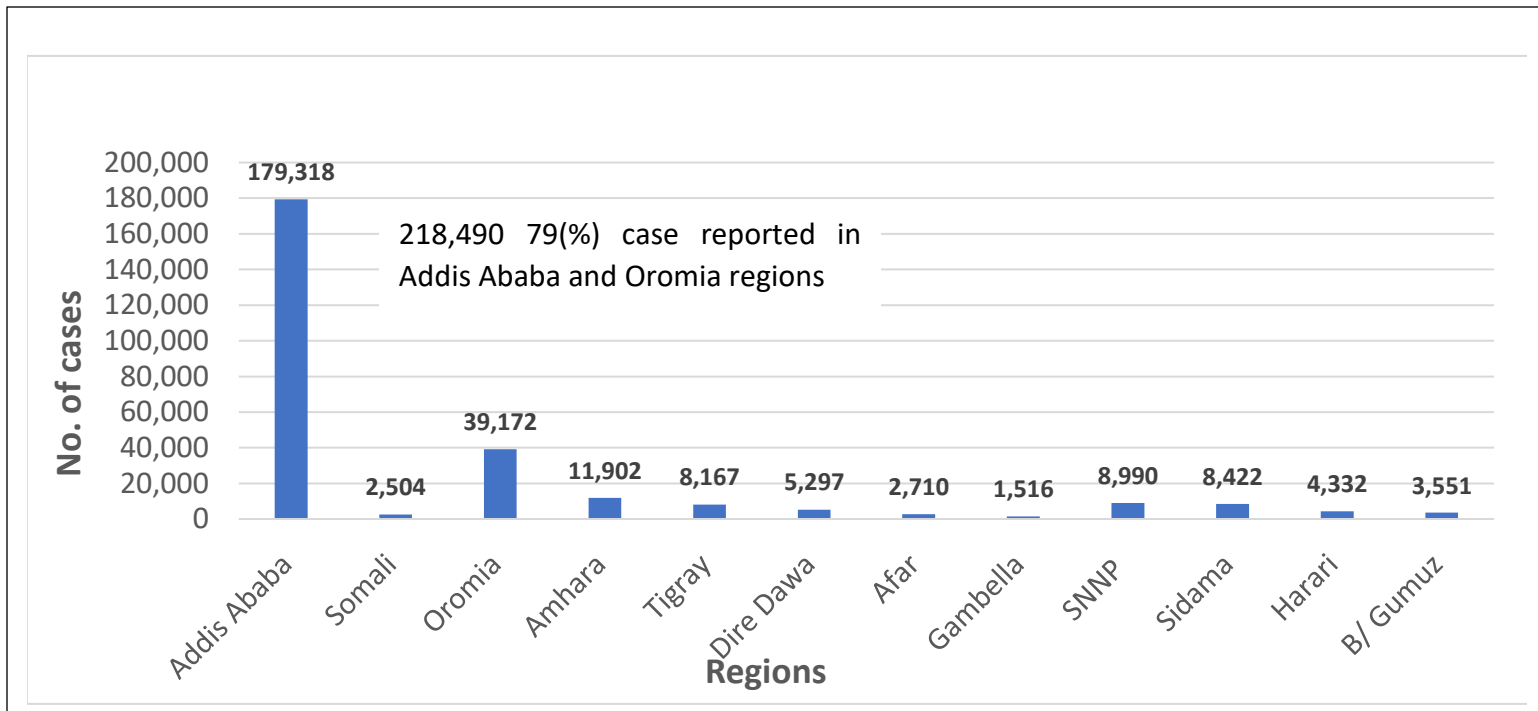




Fig 2: Cumulative COVID-19 cases in the regions in Ethiopia; 26 June 2021



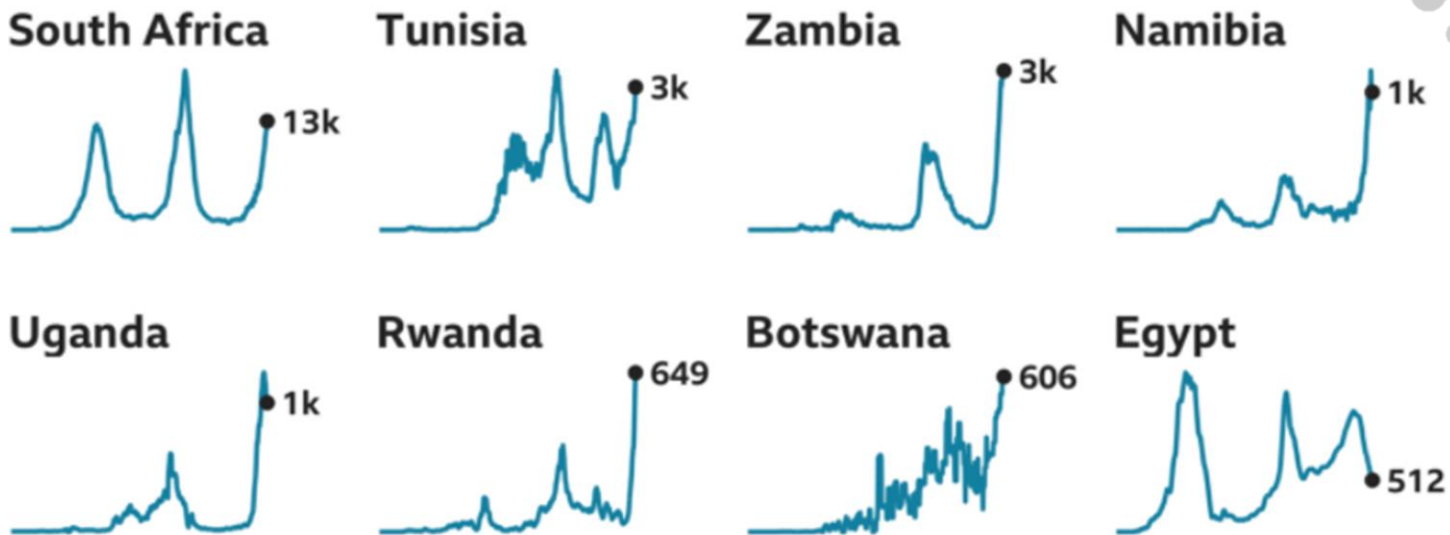

Brazil recorded 64,134 new coronavirus cases on Saturday and 1,593 new deaths. Overall the country has reported more than 18.1m cases and 507,109 deaths.

The UK recorded 18,270 new coronavirus infections – the highest daily rise since 5 February – and 23 deaths. Cases have been rising in Britain for the last month.

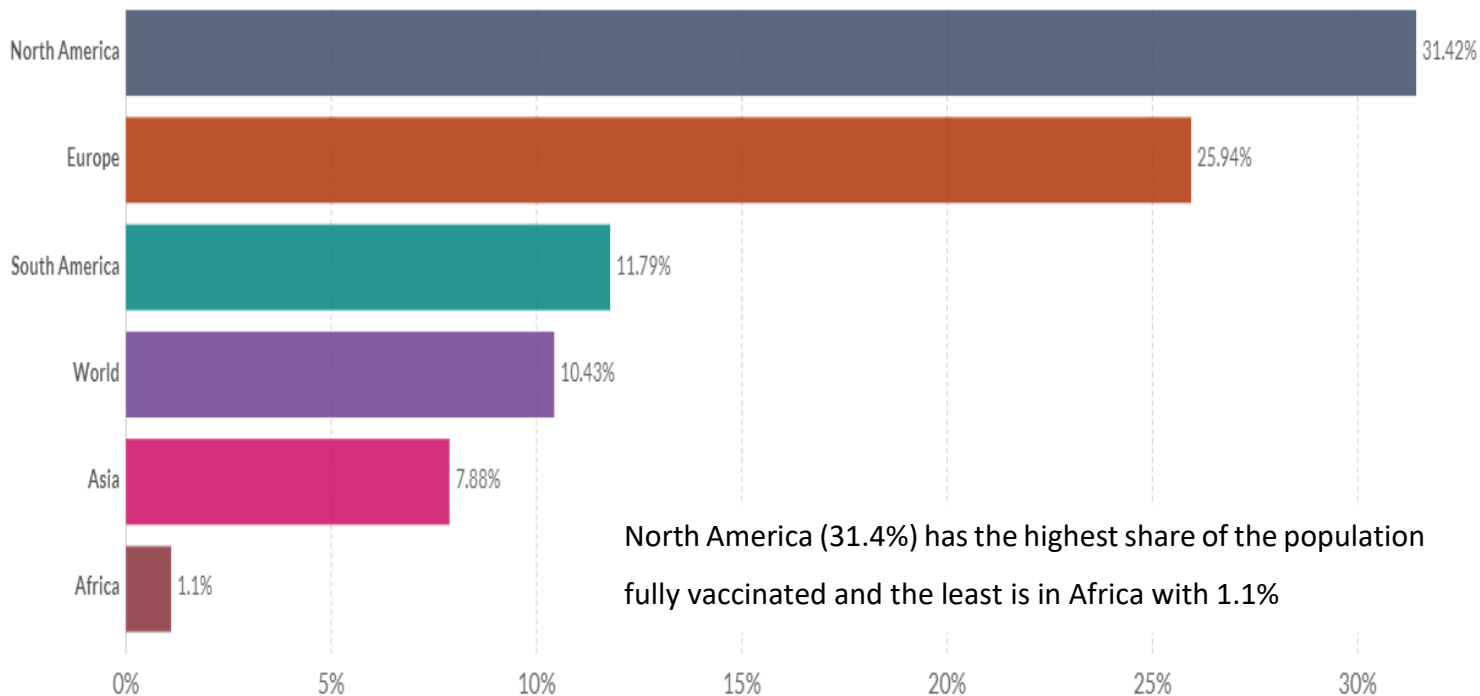


Fig. 3: Countries with the highest number of COVID-19 in the African continent; 26 June 2021
